## Reading/Language Arts:

In Reading, we read began reading *Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing*. This story focused on a boy named Peter whose life is overshadowed by his little brothers' shenanigans.

In Language Arts, we identified and personal pronouns, and labeled them as first, second, or third person pronouns.

Math: Please continue to encourage your child to practice multiplication facts as much as possible. This week we have been wrapping up chapter 4: multiplication of multiple digit numbers. Our chapter 4 test will take place on Jan. 17. Chapter 5 will focus on division.

## Science/Social Studies:

In Social Studies, we wrapped up chapter 4, and unit 1. We also watched a video about the life of Martin Luther King Jr.

In Science, students learned that all living organisms carry out 5 basic life functions. We also discussed and demonstrated how scientists organize living organisms into groups based on similar characteristics.
